3. Treasurer's Report – Trevis J. – Report Submitted

I was able to open a new non profit business bank account with First Key Bank and have 3 authorized signers which are myself, Donny F., and Don B. The Capital One Bank account was closed out and a cashiers check for \$17,061.84 was deposited into our new account along with \$678.86 that was deposited from groups and Area's that will be totaled on the Treasurer's report spreadsheet. \$50.00 of that deposit was deposited by me to open the account and I need to be reimbursed for that amount. We also had new checks debited from the account for \$18.54 which leaves us with a grand total of \$18,323.16. All checks were cleared prior to the transfer except for a lost check #1797 that was written on July 18th 2022 for \$25.00 in the amount of \$161.32. My last closing balance was 17,508.31. I added all the new deposits and subtracted the new checks fee for a total of \$18,228.83. I added the uncashed check of \$161.32 which leaves me with a total of 18,390.15 which is \$67.01 over the current bank total which I need to adjust out on the treasurer's spreadsheet to keep an accurate balance with the bank. Having online access with this new account will make it much easier to keep up with this account and find any discrepancies much faster. I'm not sure if Region wants me to re-write the lost check for \$161.32 to \$25.00.

I will continue to maintain an updated organizational Charter and By Laws, and file them (90) annually by April 1st of each calendar year. I will also file an Annual Report with the Secretary of State by April 1st of each calendar year. All and any necessary changes of Incorporation when we change officers or other changes. All of these documents are available for review if needed.

Our intent now that we are granted the 501(c)(3) status is to make policy changes to ensure that the treasurer keeps with up all the necessary legal annual filings to remain in good standing with the IRS and the Secretary of State. As of now, our legal name is Louisiana Area Region of Narcotics Anonymous. This can be changed at a later time but it will be a lot of paperwork and time to change everything. I suggest that if Region wants this changed, then we wait until after all of the annual filings are completed for this calendar year so that we have a year to get all the paperwork changed over to the amended name.

Fellowship Development

Purpose

The main purpose of the Fellowship Development Committee is to help overcome the isolation that hinders the growth and survival of Narcotics Anonymous in our areas and groups. While the main emphasis of this committee is on outreach efforts that are aimed at bringing geographically isolated NA areas or groups into the larger community, fellowship development is not limited to those activities. The committee's function may also include assistance to areas and groups isolated by such things as personal choice, language, or cultural differences. The Fellowship Development Sub-Committee shall coordinate the resources of the RSC with the needs of the individual area or groups. What Fellowship Development does, should depend on local needs.

Basic functions:

1. Maintain open lines of communication with areas and groups existing in the region.
2. Updating meeting lists
3. Functioning of phonelines
4. To seek and encourage the growth of the fellowship at all levels; including areas and groups.
5. Maintain web page (See Web Master guidelines)
6. A resource for stockpiling, maintaining, and coordinating the distribution of radio and television public service announcements. Examples: poster or public days, letters and mailings, PSAs, and/or billboards. The ways in which these may be accomplished are innumerable and unlimited.

Chair Requirements

1. Suggested minimum of 2 years clean
2. Minimum of 6 months N.A. service involvement
3. Previous service at area and/or regional levels, preferably in Public Relations
4. One year commitment
5. Ability to organize and give the committee direction and incentive Chair Duties

Chair Duties

1. Arrange agenda for meetings
2. Initiates all necessary correspondence
3. Is ultimately responsible for files, records, and overall functioning of the
4. Presides over, and is responsible for maintaining order in, meetings
5. Presents a bi-quarterly report to the RSC
6. Keeps an accurate record of committee expenditures

Greetings from the Convention Board

Hope this weekend finds you all well. Ron D. has graciously volunteered to present my report and answer any questions you may have.

Goings on with the board

The board met 12/2/22. In addition to the board members Roy M was present to represent the LRCNA Committee. Roy shared that the convention was progressing and that they are working on aspects of the program, pre-convention shirts and flyers. He also stated that they will be selling shirts at the upcoming Pre-Christmas night of fun. As well as pre-registrations, there will also be a convention registration available for the pre-convention committee. They are willing to make shirts available to anyone willing to sell them as well, as well as sending someone to sell merchandise at any area willing to have them sold at any of their functions or fundraisers. They will be meeting January the 15, at Grace Baptist church in Baton Rouge.

Board Elections

The board held its annual elections, Bob Singer was elected as Board Chair, Serena Pandos, was elected for Board treasurer, Ron Duggins was elected as vendor and web Liaison and Bob Storer was elected as the Secretary. Denise has expressed willingness to be Vice-Chair, but was unable to attend. Speaking of elections, we have 3 people who will be rolling off of the board by July of this year, Paul Payne, Bob Storer and Virginia Williams. The Region nominates and elects members to the board. Ron will be able to give you any information that you need and be able to answer any questions. We also discussed sales of literature at the convention. We have tried to get a representative from the Lone Star Region, the St Louis Region and the Florida Region at the convention site and have had no luck working it out. We will discuss at the next meeting funding a literature purchase and selling literature available at the convention. We will see how it works out. If we cant work it out this year we will have to do it next year Where do we go from here?

Funny you should ask? One of the problems that we have encountered with this bid, is the scaled back time frame the convention committee has to prepare for the convention and the lack of pre-convention merchandise available for fundraising. I would encourage all the areas to put on fundraisers for the convention. More important, we would also like to have a convention bid for 2024 as soon as possible. The earlier we can get a bid and hotel proposal/contract, the better. The board is willing to work with addicts to prepare the bid, find the hotels and come to any area that may be willing and or has any questions or their responsibilities to putting on a convention in the state of Louisiana. Please take this information back to your areas.

Future Games

The board Secretary is preparing the documents necessary to file taxes. Since they are due before the upcoming convention, it should be fairly easy. We will be the 990N postcard. The final part of the report is one of those good news, bad news, how the hell did this happen things. Early last year Paul was informed by his bank that we had a certain amount of money (we being the LRCC committee), and what did they want them to do about it. After a few months of research by Paul P and Virginia, it was determined that was a legacy account that was established by a now deceased board treasure. Paul and Virginia were the last surviving signatures on the account and they would need to come and close the account, which they did. The bank issued a check to the Louisiana Regional convention Corp in the amount of \$851.53, which was deposited in our main account. Including it in our account might be difficult and we are not entirely clear of the origin of the money and have absolutely no records on any of the above, it was decided to donate the entire amount of 851.53 to the Louisiana Region of NA. The board treasurer will issue a check and forward it to the region. I'm sure that Ron will be happy to fill you in on any questions you many have.

I am unable to attend Region because I tested positive for Covid on Thursday. I have asked Don to read my report to the Board and to place it in the minutes.

- **Number of weekly meetings** in person, zoom, and hybrid along with average meeting attendance:
 - 17 in person meetings, 1 zoom meeting, 1 Hybrid in person and zoom meeting
 - Average meeting attendance: approx. 20+/- Note: we have experienced an increase in attendance in the last couple months at several meetings.
- **Number of H&I meetings per week:**
 - Number of treatment centers and locations: We currently service 3 treatment centers:
 1. The Grove, Sorrento - every Friday night
 2. Woodlake, Ethel, LA- every Friday night
 3. Progressive, Zachary- once a month
 - Number of Correction Facilities and Locations
 1. Angola-2nd & 4th Saturday of each month
 2. DCI-1st & 3rd Wednesday or Saturday each month
 3. LCIW-1st, 3rd, 5th Saturday mornings Avg 15 people

 - Bayou Recovery Area is continuing to work with the DOC on volunteer orientation issues. Angola, DCI and LCIW are having problems with the approval process. DOC clearance certificates are not being issued and our Area is working diligently to resolve this. There has been little to no progress in this area. The volunteers have been oriented and their paperwork submitted, but DOC isn't responding to our Area's request for clearance certificates.

 1. Red River Treatment Center, Tioga 1st Tuesday's (Men), 3rd Tuesday's (Women)
 2. Steps Recovery Solutions, Pineville – every 4th Friday monthly
 3. Edgefield Treatment Choneyville – every 2nd Friday monthly
 - Number of Correction Facilities and Locations

- **Total size of Central Area Fellowship:** approximately 50+/-
- **H & I Activity/plans:**
 - H&I Learning Day- a potential plan is in the works for an H&I learning day/orientation sometime this year.
 - H&I is planning to coordinate with P.R. to start a monthly meeting at one of our correctional facilities.
- **PR Activity/plans:**
 - P.R. contacted one of our local T.V. stations to have them broadcast our newly formed PSA and will continue to contact more stations in our local area.
 - P.R. is in the planning stages of doing our annual poster drive and they continue to keep our local meetings schedules updated in the data base and distribute them to some of our local facilities where H&I does not have panel meetings and other community areas that will allow us to distribute them.
- **Other community activities:** None planned right now.
- **Major accomplishments:** Our Area Activities committee continues to host events in our area, and we invite our local treatment centers to attend. We have combined our sub-committee's due to the small size of our fellowship in our Area and our subcommittee meetings are well attended and the work of these combined committees are being accomplished. We have also started a Women's Meeting on Mondays at 7pm.
- **Specific problems or situations:** We have been informed that federal and state policies that affect our local treatment centers, drug courts and other recovery related programs are not allowed to mandate a 12 step fellowship during and after treatment due to the fellowship using the word God which they consider religious affiliation under their policy of best practices. This is discouraging to the staff at these facilities because they understand the importance of a 12 step program and recommending that to their clients during and upon discharge from treatment. This is one of the reasons why our meeting attendance in our Area has dropped. We are trying to counter this by inviting the treatment center clients to volunteer to attend our functions and meetings and consistently doing H&I & P.R. work there. We also had some members from our local sober living houses such as Oxford and similar affiliations tell us that these places are trying to force and or discourage their residence/clients from attending N.A. meetings.
- **Area plans for upcoming year:** Our Area plans on bidding for the 2024 Convention and we plan on holding our 2023 Convention Fundraiser in late April to early May.

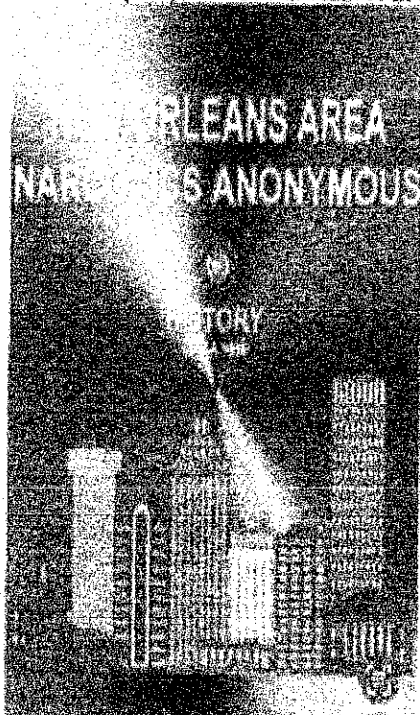

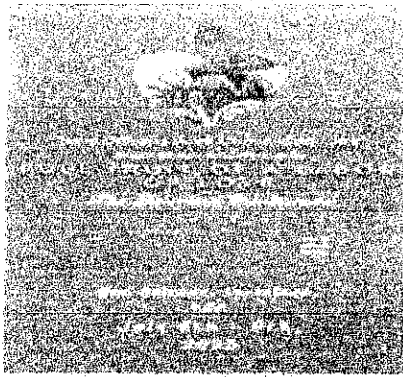
